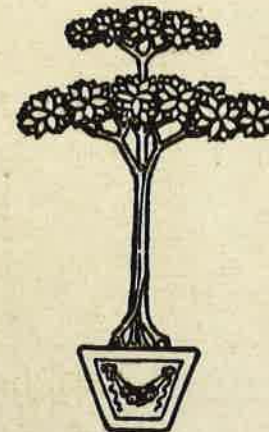

| DEUTZIA CRENATA— | | |
| A fine, hardy shrub with luxuriant foliage, and a profusion of flowers, double white tinged with rose. | .50 | 4.00 |
| FLOWERING CURRANT (<i>Ribes Sanguineum</i>)— | | |
| Colour crimson; produces an abundance of flowers in early Spring. | .50 | 4.00 |
| GARLAND MOCK ORANGE (<i>Philadelphus Coronarius</i>)— | | |
| Flowers pure white, delightful orange blossom fragrance. One of the first to bloom. | .50 | 4.00 |
| HAZEL, Purple Leaved (<i>Corylus Purpurea</i>)— | | |
