President's Message:



In December 2015 we celebrated the ground-breaking for the new Montebello Block at the R.J. Haney Heritage Village. This was a very exciting day for the Association and our generous partners

who have donated to the project.

At this time construction is well under way. The foundation walls and floors and the Archives vault have had the concrete poured and framing is currently in progress. A project as large as this one presents many challenges. Because we are constructing a public building we must meet strict building code requirements.

We believe we owe it to our donors to be fiscally responsible with their generous donations of money and materials. As a historical facility we are also committed to educating our visitors about how life was lived in the time period the Village depicts. This means ideally we would use only authentic materials that would have been available at that time.

At every point of the construction process we are faced



with decisions such as which material is appropriate. An example of this is the roofing materials for the peaked roof portions of the building. Today's builders would use modern shingles or even a material made to resemble cedar

shakes. However they don't really look the same and while the average visitor might not notice exactly

what is "wrong with the picture" they will know something is off. Our curator has spent countless hours scanning photographs from the period to confirm that roofing used on businesses was cedar shakes or cedar shingles. In the early years the shingles were often made from trees fallen on the property. On barns or sheds they might have used tin or rolled asphalt roofing. There are still a few mills where we are able to source cedar shakes and that is the correct material to use and we will do so wherever a roof is visible to the public.



Appropriate siding is another area under discussion. We are fortunate to have very generous donations of material and a local mill which can mill the appropriate profiles for our siding. We will use

several different types of siding on the businesses to make it appear they were built at different times. Some will have paint and detailed trim while others will be much simpler in design and others will be left unpainted.

Working with authentic turn of the century materials but having to meet 2016 building codes is a constant struggle. We are confident we can work through all the challenges and in the end the Salmon Arm Museum will have new archives, artifact storage facility, museum gallery, administration offices and nine new dioramas in which we will continue to tell the stories of the area.

This important project is by far the largest ever undertaken by this small group of dedicated volunteers. We are proud of our progress today and of course we are very grateful for the support shown by so many people and organizations in the community. From The Curator: Online Exhibit Flight From The Flames Update:

The English version of the Salmon Arm Museum's online exhibit *Flight* from the flames was submitted for

review February 14. Feedback has been positive. Unfortunately, technical edits were required. It turned out that every person who submitted stories needed their own supporting gallery page of photographs and not just a story page. I learned that the approach is intended to capture the younger, "butterfly" generation of museum learners. Generating the pages took a couple of weekends, but the images were reordered, and the additional galleries and connecting links to story pages were created. Great! Another deliverable was checked off.



We are now hard at work mirroring and translating the exhibit into French. The exhibit will be enhanced for the visually impaired, both in French and English. They include three

translated and subtitled video interviews with Retired RCMP Staff Sergeant Barry Tarr, Retired Fire Chief Ken Tebo, and Fire Warden Jake Jacobson. Both sites feature cartoons by the late Bob Muirhead, transcribed and audio radio coverage, and more than 200 photographs taken by James Murray, Sally Scales, Gordon Pelletier, and Jake Jacobson.

The French translation has been a challenge for archives volunteer, Lise Ouimet. She has spent uncounted hours translating the sense of the text that she has been given. She is justifiably proud of the job she is doing – setting out to write the story well, not just translate it word for word. None of this app translation stuff for Lise!



Although she is technologically advanced, has access to apps to translate any text into any language, she says the automated translation service is awful.

"We don't speak that way," Lise says when asked, "They are terrible."



I am glad Lise has set high standards for herself. She is on a mission - to engage our French audiences, not turn them off.

The project has grown leaps and bounds since Lise agreed to do it. Translation is required for pages that had not been created or thought of when the project's contract was drawn

and agreed to by Lise. An added complication was the interviews that took three times as long, so three times as many words were generated.



But every writer needs an editor. Lise is quick to point out that she's been living in an Anglophone community for more than 40 years and her translations might reflect that. Lise's work was

checked by a third party, her sister Carole, living in a francophone community in Quebec.

When all is said and done, Lise *was* grey before the project started, but this project has made her greyer – a comment she doesn't care to translate!

So where will this exhibit be found? Hosted online by the Community Memories, it will run for six years. Our advisor, Debra Rohac, at the Canadian Museum of History in Gatineau, Que. has been extremely helpful and with the completion of the English half of the project, made the comment. "I can't wait to share this exhibit with the world!"


